There is a one time entry fee of \$10.00 per artist. Entry fees are not refundable. If accepted, artists will be permitted to display up to two works. Application form will be up on the ALOC website shortly.

Monetary awards will be given for Best in Show, First, Second and Third place in each category. Two Honorable mention ribbons also will be awarded in each category.
