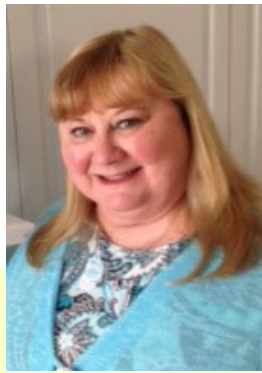

## WHO'S WHO IN THE ART LEAGUE— Gail Philippi

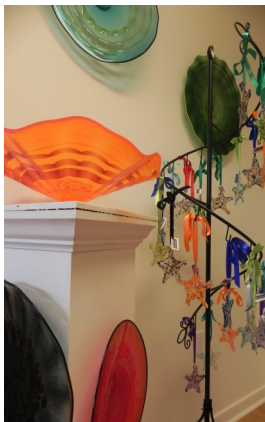


### Who's Who in the Art League ~

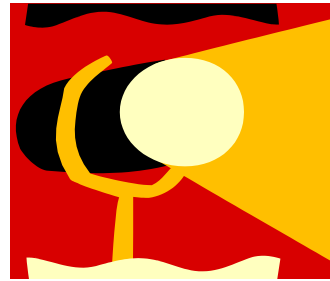

### Why Art Matters

In the last edition of the newsletter, I touched on why art matters to society. Since then, I have been asking people here at the Ocean City Center for the Arts, why the Art League of Ocean City matters to them.

Here are some of their answers:

- It keeps me sane.
- I have made so many friends here.
- I love looking at the exhibits.
- It makes me feel good to help.
- The classes are great.
- I don't know what I would do without it.
- It gets me out of the house.
- My kids love doing the pottery and the art camp.

But perhaps one of the most touching stories came from the advocate/mentor of a gentleman who comes to our pottery and painting classes often. He is 54 years old and lives at home with his elderly parents. He suffered a stroke when he was small which had an effect on his cognitive abilities and mobility. His advocate, who attends the classes with him told me, "art for him is a daily coping mechanism. I have taught him paper mache, simple mosaics, and other types of crafts since I started with him 6 years ago. Now that the art center is available...not only art classes...but socialization! When he has participated in a class, and helping to clean up afterwards, makes him shine...in his world". "He often reflects on his time there and proudly shows everyone his creations made there."

Now, that is why art matters...

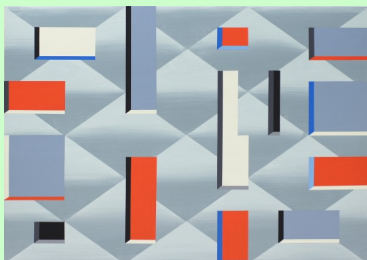
