The Art League talks with B.L. Strang-Moya, OC Film Festival Director, about what's up for 2021.

Will there be a 5th Annual OC Film Festival in 2021, and how is it adapting to the new normal?

The OC Film Fest will go virtual from March 4 -7. We are also planning a hybrid program that would include drive-in events at a later date. Adapting to the pandemic has been truly humbling as we reflect on what we've accomplished as a film festival and how we've been able to continually engage the community virtually. Moving our events online has surprisingly enabled us to branch out to more filmmakers and more audiences.

We are featuring Maryland talent in our horror block, and it's one of our stronger horror showcases ever, especially for those who are interested in practical visual effects.

Obviously, we'll miss coming together to celebrate the art of film. But are there advantages to watching films from home?

Viewers can watch on their own time and see all the films in the festival, which has not been possible in the past. Every seat is the best seat in the house! Plus you can watch in your PJs, in the middle of the night, or with your own pod of friends and family.

Are you planning any Film Festival watch parties and how will they work?

What are dates, and how will the audience view the films?

Set dates are March 4-7, 2021, but it's possible we will extend the dates and add future events. The audience will view the films on Eventive, a proven easy-to-use, high-quality streaming service that specializes in small film festivals like ours.

About how many films do you expect to show, and what are some of the categories?

We will be featuring approximately 100 films including feature films, documentaries, aquatic/environmental films, horror, comedy, and feel-good short films plus specially invited films.

Can you give us a teaser as to some of the films you're excited about for this year?

We will be featuring Eric Walter's *My Amityville Horror* in anticipation of his upcoming feature *Dark Side of the Mountain*. Walter grew up in Salisbury, worked at WBOC, and now lives in Los Angeles. He is an acclaimed filmmaker and proud Easternshoreman whom we are excited to offer a homecoming. I'm also enthused by our environmental/aquatic shorts that will resonate with our hometown viewers. We will conduct live Q&A sessions and panel discussions throughout the event as well as watch parties, most likely on Eventive, where folks can gather to discuss the films. We will also strive to incorporate as much live interaction with the filmmakers as possible.

There was talk of showing films in a drive-in setting, but March is not an ideal time for that. What's down the road in 2021 after March for the Film Festival?

We are anticipating one or more drive-in events in late spring or early summer. If and when we do this, we will be featuring highlights of our virtual festival and essentially recreate it as an in-person function made for drive-in.




